

CAL NORTHERN SCHOOL OF LAW ATTRITION RATES

Attrition rates are used in higher education to measure the extent to which a program's student body fails to re-enroll in a program. In the Fall of 2019, 46 students enrolled. In the spring of 2020, there were 50 students enrolled. Some students re-enrolled after taking leaves of absence.
